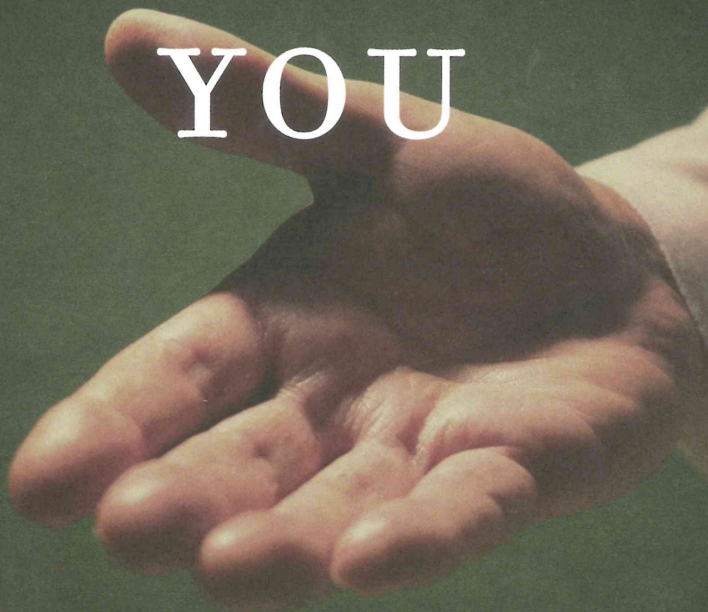

OLD TESTAMENT READING *Joel 2:12–19*

Lector: “Yet even now,” declares the LORD, “return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.”

***CONFESSIONAL ADDRESS**

*IMPOSITION OF ASHES *Genesis 3:19*

Pastor: Almighty and everlasting God, You spoke to Adam and Eve in the garden and said, “You are dust, and to dust you shall return.” Your people of ancient times wore sackcloth and ashes as a sign of repentance. We remember our sinfulness through the ashes and remember the gracious gift of forgiveness through the cross of Jesus Christ, our Savior.

People: **Amen.**

The Pastor and assistants receive ashes first, followed by the congregation. Using a Q-tip, the Pastor, or an assistant, places the ashes on the forehead of each person in the sign of the cross, saying:

Elder/Pastor: “Dust you are, and to dust you shall return.”

People: **Amen.**

After receiving the ashes, each person returns to his or her place in silence. There is no statement of dismissal.

*CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Nicene Creed



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RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord's Supper, also known as Holy Communion or the Eucharist, is celebrated at Epiphany Lutheran Church in the confession and glad confidence that our Lord Jesus Christ gives us His very body and blood "in, with, and under" the bread and wine for

the forgiveness of our sins, and to strengthen our unity with Christ and our Christian brothers and sisters. Our Lord invites to His table those baptized Christians who trust His Word, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive others as He loves and forgives us. Scripture urges us to examine our conscience and belief about Holy Communion before we partake of the Supper (1 Cor. 11:28). Because those who partake of the Lord's Supper unworthily do so to their great harm, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession differing from that of this congregation and The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod (LCMS), and yet desire to receive the Sacrament, are asked first to speak with the Pastor or an Elder. For further study, see Matthew 26:26-29; 5:23-26; 18:15-35; 1 Corinthians 10:16-17; 11:17-34.

Children and uninstructed youth and adults may receive a blessing by crossing their arms over their chest, which is known as the sign of St. Andrew's cross.

White grape juice and gluten free Communion wafers are available for those with alcohol sensitivity or gluten intolerance.

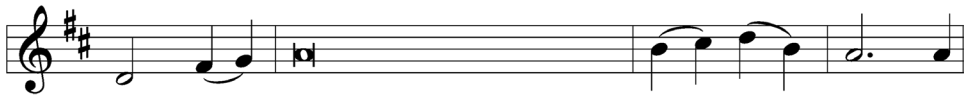
