5-31-23

v. 1) Refrain (cf. v. 9)

"O **LORD**, our **Lord**..."

YHWH Adonai

nb: LXX "translates" both as Kúpios, but they're ≠ same

Theme: Glory of Yahweh's name revealed in creation

cf. Rom. 1:20 - "they are without excuse"

↳ cp. Gen 1:1-2:4,  
(OT Lesson)

v. 2) Jesus quotes this at "Triumphal" entry to Jerusalem on Palm Sun.  
Matt. 21:16

nb: Versification is different  
in Hebrew Bible (MT)  
than in English versions.

v. 3) astronomical bodies  
are amazing.

Q. Do you study the moon  
and stars?

nb: Rob't. Harmon has learned  
how to navigate by the  
stars.

v. 4) "man" = ωιχ<sup>ω</sup>

"son of man" = θτ<sup>θ</sup>χ-γ<sup>θ</sup>

nb: LXX and Vul follow MT.

LXX: "man" = ἄνθρωπος

mindful = γεν<sup>θ</sup>τ = remember

care = θε<sup>θ</sup>ητ = make a  
search; visit

v. 5) "heavenly beings" =

Θ' Θ' ΛΧ<sup>ω</sup> = God/gods

LXX: ἀγγέλους (angels)

v. 6) "give dominion" =  
hifil of שׁוֹר  
↓  
"judge"

LXX: καθίστημι

\* not same verb  
as Gen. 1:26 רְאֵת

VV. 7-8) all animal kingdom:  
birds, fish & beasts

v. 9) Refrain (cf. v. 1) -  
forms inclusio around  
Psalm

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Review: Hebrew parallelism

synonymous  
synthetic  
antithetical  
building → climax

nb: Translation matters

! new NIV turns vs. 4 into generic plurals instead of masc. singular.  
It neuters Christ!

"what is mankind that you are mindful of them, human beings that you care for ~~?!~~ them?"

masc. sing.  
in Heb.

They even botch it up  
in Hebrews 2:6-8!

## Commentaries

v.1) Adonai is "honorific" plural  
(Saleska, p. 218)

Psalmist praises YHWH, not creation.

Humans are creatures, but God isn't.

Modern science marvels at universe & decides humanity is small & insignificant, not very important or remarkable.

But Psalmist looks at creation and realizes man is God's crowning achievement. It defies reason, but it's true (cp. John 3:16)

man alone is made in God's image & likeness,  
(expressed in dominion).

Study of animal intelligence in dolphins, apes, and dogs may convince people we're not so different than the animals. (Language, feelings, etc.). But that's not what Bible teaches.

Yet after the Fall, we no longer bear God's image. Image of God is lost in humanity.

Christ alone is the true image of the invisible God. We are being conformed to his image, and when he appears, we shall be like him.
